Maxillofacial Surgery

The complex Maxillofacial Surgery operational unit takes care of cranial-maxillo-facial and neck disorders. In particular, it operates in the following fields:

- traumatic pathology
- <u>oncological pathology</u>: Benign and malignant tumors of the mouth, face, salivary glands, orbital region, neck. In these cases, the operation involves the removal of the tumor and, if necessary, the reconstruction of the defective part by means of sophisticated microsurgical techniques
- <u>facial anomalies</u>, either congenital (emifacial microsomies, cleft lip and palate, anomalies of the ear) or acquired (skeletal abnormalities of the jaws such as Prognathism, asymmetry, operated both from the occlusal and aesthetic viewpoint)
- <u>Cosmetic Surgery</u> (Rhinoplasty, otoplasty, blepharoplasty, genoplasty) and <u>preprosthetic surgery</u> which are carried out under by private physicians in a public health-institute.

Clinic

At the clinic, first examinations are made on patients with congenital or acquired facial deformities, facial traumae, benign and malignant tumors of the cranio-maxillo-facial and neck regions.

Doctors also conduct follow-up examinations on patients already operated at this facility.

The following are performed in outpatient settings: small facial skin cancers and oral surgery for cysts of the jaws, teeth, oral mucosa tumors.

Day hospital

The day surgery activity involves oral surgery for cysts, impacted teeth and minor pathologies the oral-maxillo-facial region, evaluation of skin scarring and skin cancer.
