

Ophthalmology

Surgeries

General surgery - open Monday to Friday, 8.00 to 14.00.

The examination must be booked at the check-in counter (ground floor facing the ticket counter) with relevant prescription + NHS card and documentation concerning possible exemption.

Fluorescein angiography, OCT, Laser Therapy and Laser YAG: the examination must be booked on the 2nd floor carrying the report of the medical examination already carried out and the NHS card.

Glaucoma and Eye range surgery: the examination must be booked at the check-in counter (ground floor facing the ticket counter) with relevant prescription + NHS card and documentation concerning possible exemption.

Day Surgery: once the result of the examination is obtained, an appointment must be booked on the 2nd floor to carry out the examinations necessary for the pre-hospitalization procedure.

Once the hospitalization process is completed, the surgery is scheduled.

Orthoptics surgery: the examination can be booked by calling the CUP or by going directly in the clinic (Ground floor - near the Ticket counter).

Urgent examinations are carried out every day Monday to Saturday during the following hours:

Monday to Thursday, 7.30 to 17.30, on Friday, 07.30 to 14.30, on Saturday, 07.30 to 13.00.

PATIENTS MUST HAVE A REFERRAL ISSUED BY THEIR FAMILY DOCTOR AND THE RECEIPT OF PAYMENT OF THE "TICKET".

Patients in need of urgent examination which do not have a referral from their doctor must go to the General Emergency Room (Viale Italia) and if necessary they will be directed to the Ophthalmology Unit.

All patients requiring urgent examination must go to the emergency room any day of the week after 18.00, on Saturday afternoons, Sundays and public holidays.

Ward

The Ward of Ophthalmology Unit includes 12 beds, including 8 for ordinary hospitalization (7 + 1 crib) and 4 for Day Hospital.

Patients can receive visitors 12.00 to 14.00 and 18.00 to 20.00. In any case, the ward is always open to visitors, but it requires compliance with the rules to ensure the welfare of people and the 24/7 assistance of medical and nursing staff.
